Agastache foeniculum is a pollinator magnet! At 4' tall, is one of the tallest of our native mints, and also one of the most ornamental. Beginning in mid-summer, it produces dense, cylindrical, bluish flower spikes that can be up to 6" long, and persist for over 2 months. The leaves emit a pleasan, anise-like aroma when bruised

It is easy to grow, and well adapted to average well-drained soils. It is tolerant of part-shade, but flower production is at its best when in full-sun. Remove spent flowers to extend bloom time. It spreads by rhizomes to form dense colonies.
