Agastache foeniculum

Light Requirements: **sun, part-sun**

Soil Moisture: **dry, moist**

Soil Description: **average, loam, clay, sand, gravel/rock**

Height: **2' – 4'**

Recommended Spacing: **12"-16"**

Bloom Time: **July, August, September**

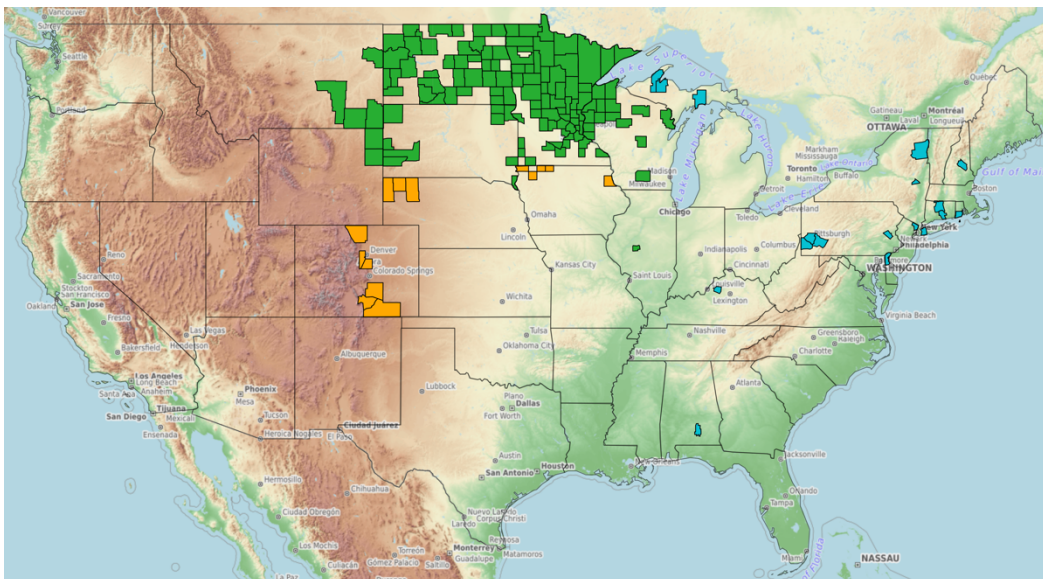
Bloom Color: **purple, lavender, blue**

Hardiness Zone: **3, 4, 5, 6, 7**

Additional Tags: **attracts hummingbirds, cut flowers, deer resistant, drought tolerant, colonizing, pollinator favorite, rock garden plant**

Agastache foeniculum is a pollinator magnet! At 4' tall, is one of the tallest of our native mints, and also one of the most ornamental. Beginning in mid-summer, it produces dense, cylindrical, bluish flower spikes that can be up to 6" long, and persist for over 2 months. The leaves emit a pleasant, anise-like aroma when bruised

It is easy to grow, and well adapted to average well-drained soils. It is tolerant of part-shade, but flower production is at its best when in full-sun. Remove spent flowers to extend bloom time. It spreads by rhizomes to form dense colonies.
