# Dicentra eximia

## fringed bleeding heart



Light Requirements: **part-sun, part-shade**

Soil Moisture: **moist**

Soil Description: **acid, rich, loam**

Height: **12"-18"**

Recommended Spacing: **10"-12"**

Bloom Time: **April, May**

Bloom Color: **purple, pink, lilac**

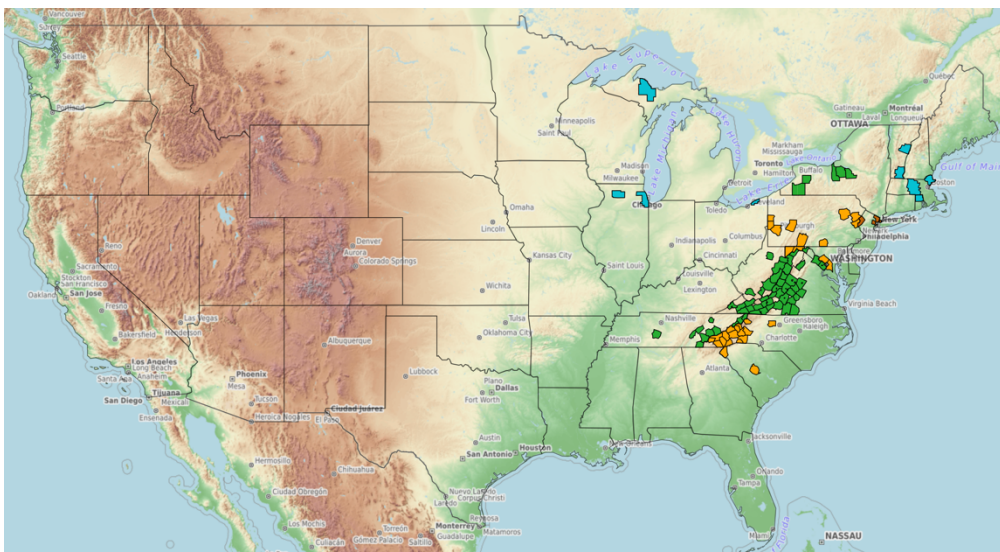
Leaf Color: **green**

Hardiness Zone: **4, 5, 6, 7, 8**

Additional Tags: **colonizing, deer resistant, evergreen/semi-evergreen, ornamental foliage, shade garden plant**

Also known as wild bleeding heart, this species has it all: attractive, highly dissected foliage, and a long blooming period that begins in early spring and continues sporadically throughout the growing season.

It prefers rich, moist, well-drained soil. Avoid deep shade. It is best grown under the open shade provided by trees with a high canopy where it will be protected from direct sun yet will receive ample filtered light.
