Light Requirements: **sun, part-sun, part-shade**

Soil Moisture: **dry, moist**

Soil Description: **neutral, alkaline, average**

Height: **2'-3'**

Recommended Spacing: **16"-20"**

Bloom Time: **July, August, September**

Bloom Color: **white, pink**

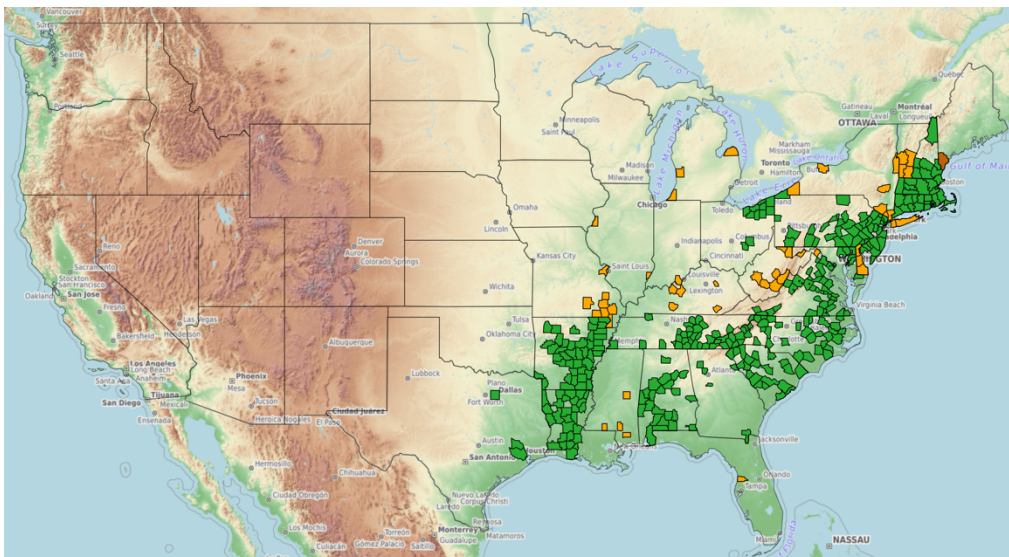
Hardiness Zone: **5, 6, 7, 8**

Additional Tags: **colonizing, drought tolerant, ornamental foliage, pollinator favorite**

A compact, dense-growing, attractive member of the Mint family, that typically grows to a height of 3'. The leaves produce a strong spearmint aroma when crushed and are a formidable deer deterrent. The individual pinkish-white flowers are tiny, but form dense button-like clusters about 1" in diameter. The base of each cluster sports 2 large, silvery, leafy bracts that will give the plant an overall grayish appearance when in full bloom.

Very easy to grow in average, moist to dry soils, in part- to full sun. Under ideal conditions It can spread vigorously, but is not as aggressive as exotic mints, and can be easily controlled. Its dense habit and silvery appearance make it a great accent plant, equally attractive in large groups.

Be prepared for your plants to be abuzz with pollinators!
