

Rudbeckia fulgida var. deamii is a naturally occurring botanical variety of R. fulgida, with a small native range limited to IL, IN, and OH. It is similar in many ways to the straight species, and can be difficult to differentiate without a side by side comparison. At 5" long and up the 3" across, its conspicuously toothed leaves tend to be larger than those of the straight species and, along with the stems, are also hairier. It is also slightly taller and with smaller flowers (1" to 2" across). These are however borne profusely and the overall effect of the plant is more elegant than the straight species as well as its most common cultivar 'Goldsturm'. R.fulguida var. deamii is also significantly more disease resistant than 'Goldsturm'
